FROM THE DIRECTOR:

This play is written to be performed on a bare stage.
There is no scenery, no props, and no mime.
There should be no furniture.
Light and sound should not be used to indicate a change in time or place.

Duncan Macmillan's instructions above, in his author's note, indicates what should not be featured on stage in his play, but the challenge for the director, the actors, and the designers of a production of *Lungs* is to answer, what then is depicted on stage? What determines the blocking and imagery in the design and performance?

This production features three pairs of actors, exploring the characters' emotional lives as a foundation for the physical and visual life of the play. The actors' spatial relationships on the empty stage and their interaction with the design of the production reflect their journey through the characters' lives. With three different casts, we have worked to keep three distinct artistic interpretations of the characters, while also emphasizing a stylistic unity on the production.

This production would not have been possible without the outstanding support of student assistant directors Savannah Maive and Jakob Cansler. They each offered important and creative contributions to the staging and interpretation of the play while working with the casts in rehearsal.
